Director's Notes

As a director, I am drawn to pieces of theatre that are poetic—rich with visual imagery and that possess moments of great beauty in the midst of tremendous hardship and heartbreak. These plays, like real life, capture my heart because they reveal my own struggle to understand the mysterious journey of life and make me feel deeply connected to the larger human community.

Sarah Ruhl's, *Eurydice* is just such a play. Her modern retelling of the classic myth of Orpheus (who descends into the Underworld to retrieve his lost love) traces Eurydice's journey in the Underworld as a woman still in search of a life and a love of meaning.

Though shrouded within the metaphor of death, the play is about the journey of life and the stages of love and loss, and the lengths we go to in order quell the constant ache of loneliness and fulfill the longing of our hearts. As Eurydice struggles for self-knowledge, we, like the characters in the play, discover the sacrifices that must be made in order to possess a life that has, as its essential part, a deeply meaningful love—and too, what happens to us if we don't find it or, worse, find it, but can't have it.

As an artist, like the Orpheus in the play—sorrowfully discovering his need to have a life filled with more than just the beauty of his art, I journey now, once again, to find it.

For my Mother ~ who told me it would be like this, And to Kate ~ for reminding me it would be so.
