Director's Notes

What is wrong with wanting to live a life of value and desiring to find, have, and hold a lover/partner worthy of living such a life? Is this not something we all want and seek to find in our own lives? While difficult to find, even in a heterosexual relationship, Diana Son's *Stop Kiss* puts issues of social conformity, peer pressure, and moral structure in direct conflict with making a commitment to living a life that is rich in meaning and value.

Told through an unusual timeline, juxtaposing past and future events, *Stop Kiss* explores the relationship of two heterosexual women who meet and surprisingly discover that they have a desire for a deeper relationship with each other. Transcending the stereotypes of a gay/lesbian romance, *Stop Kiss* embodies the broader themes of love, personal identity, and the desire for a rewarding life regardless of society's ideas of what constitutes an appropriate partnership.

Along with the intense thematic movement of the script, what interested me in choosing to direct *Stop Kiss* was how to address the cinematic nature of the script—a growing trend we are seeing in the theatre as new writers abandon classical dramatic structure in order to create a world on the stage that can compete with the expectations of audiences grown accustomed to the technical wizardry of television and film. In choosing to produce *Stop Kiss*, with its instantaneous time and location changes, the challenge for the entire production team—including the actors, was to how to make the play move believably, not so much cinematically, but theatrically.

In continuing my commitment to producing socially relevant, challenging and engaging productions, I am very excited to present Diana Son's *Stop Kiss*. Given our current times, with questions of morality and biblical teaching determining civil and government policies, it is a fitting and appropriate choice. With such relevant subject matter, strong characters, and challenging production format, it is also a great piece of theatre for our students to work on.
